#### Skateboard artwork unit

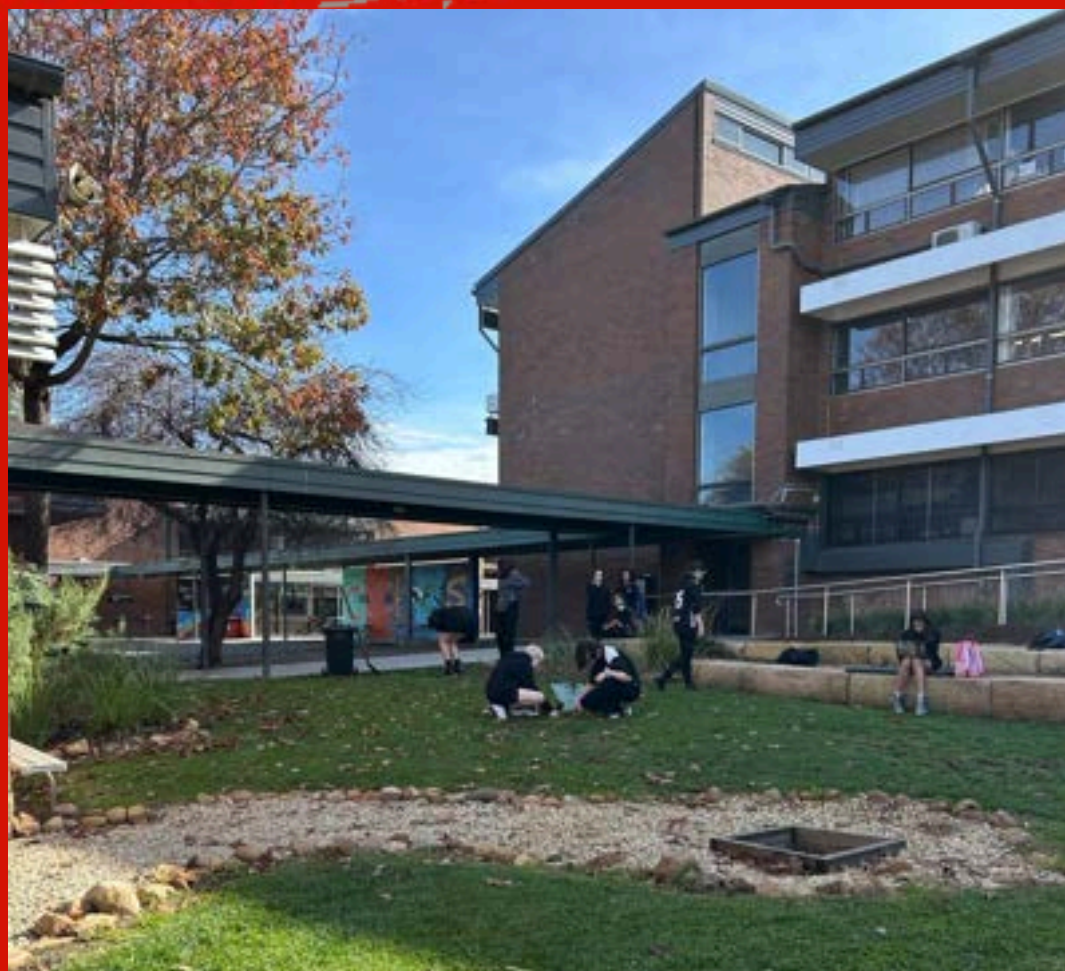
